

REPORT: DIAMOND JUBILEE EVENTS – 2016-17.

Dr (Mrs.) E. Kharkongor, Convener, Organizing Committee, Diamond Jubilee Committee, Celebration.

The Diamond Jubilee Year started on a high note with the college being accredited with an A Grade by NAAC on May 2016. The first meeting of the Organizing Committee constituted in connection with the Celebration of Diamond Jubilee of the College which met on 15th June, 2016 decided that the inauguration of the celebration would be held on 14th July, 2016 to coincide with the Two Day National Seminar on Applied Ethics on the theme: “Issues in Contemporary Society: Rights, Duties and Sustainability - In Search Of Harmony” that was organized by the Department of Philosophy in collaboration with IQAC to be held on the 14th – 15th July, 2016. From then onwards the Committee which met several times chalked the calendar of events whilst keeping in mind the academic interest of the students and also ensuring that all stakeholders take part in the celebrations. It was also suggested that all programmes and events organized by departments, cells, committees, non-teaching staff, alumni and others should be inclusive of the Diamond Jubilee Celebration. Various committees were formed to ensure proper coordination and participation from all stakeholders in the celebration and subsequently different programmes, activities and events were organized to celebrate the Diamond Jubilee Year in a befitting manner. These are as follows:

1. The Diamond Jubilee Celebration of the college was inaugurated on the 14th July, 2016 by Hon’ble Prof. M.Miri, Former Vice Chancellor, North Eastern Hill University & Former Member of Parliament, Rajya Sabha in the presence of Dr. (Mrs.) Ampareen Lyngdoh, Minister, of PWD (Buildings), Information Technology etc. Government of Meghalaya and a host of other dignitaries, invitees and guests. To mark the beginning of the yearlong celebration a Two Day National Seminar on Applied Ethics on the theme: “Issues in Contemporary Society: Rights, Duties and Sustainability In Search Of Harmony” was organized by the Department of Philosophy in collaboration with IQAC on 14th – 15th July, 2016. The seminar was sponsored by UGC & ICPR, New Delhi.
2. The Fourth Batch of the UGC sponsored Three Months Certificate Course in Entrepreneurship Development organized by the Entrepreneurship Development Cell commenced on 15th July, 2016.

The Meghalaya Institute of Entrepreneurship has also sponsored a number of budding entrepreneurs to attend the course.

6. This program was participated by NCC cadets from Shillong Commerce College and St. Anthony's College.

63. The Rovers & Rangers Cell, Shillong College organized a programme entitled “Surf Smart” and “Free Being Me”, on 28th July 2017. The Superintendent of Police, East Khasi Hills District, Mr. D. Marak graced the occasion as Chief Guest.
64. A Self Defense Training for women was organized by Women Cell in collaboration with Meghalaya School of Martial Arts on 17th August, 2017. The programme was well attended and the training imparted included kicking, wushu, JeetKune-do, Zendokai Karate, Kungfu, & Muay Thai.
65. A Workshop on Online Safety was organized by Womens’ Cell in collaboration with Centre for Social Research, New Delhi on 18th August, 2017.
66. The Diamond Jubilee Year witnessed the inauguration of the Certificate Course on Solid Waste Management conducted by the Department of Environmental Science in collaboration with Entrepreneurship Development Cell and IQAC on 18th August, 2017. The Course is funded under RUSA Equity Initiative.
67. Likewise the Coaching Class for Competitive Examinations under RUSA Equity was inaugurated on the 21st August 2017 in the presence of the Principal, Vice Principal, Shillong College, Coordinator IQAC and Principal Consultant (RUSA), faculties and other resources persons.
68. Annual Social, Cultural & Sports Week organized by the Shillong College Students’ Union commenced from 21st August, 2017, culminating with a beauty pageant followed by a grand formal function on 26th August, 2017.
69. Along with the different competitions of singing, dancing, debates & quiz etc. organized a Food Fest was also held on the 22nd August, 2017 organized by the Food & Refreshment Committee which focus on ethnic food variety of the different tribes of Meghalaya.
70. On 23rd August, 2017 the college took part in the Cleaning Drive that was organized by the NSS, NCC, YRC & Rovers & Rangers and the college prepared for the Inauguration of the International Seminar on the 24th August, 2017.
71. Inaugural Function of International Seminar on *Cross Border Connectivity and Inclusive Growth: Possibilities and Challenges with Special Reference to the North Eastern Region* organized as part

of the closing ceremony of the Diamond Jubilee Celebration on 24th August, 2017. A brief highlight of the function is given below:

The inauguration was graced by our Hon'ble Member of Parliament Shri Conrad Sangma as the Chief Guest, Prof S.K Srivastava, Vice Chancellor, North Eastern Hill University, Shillong as the Guest of Honor, Prof Mahendra, P.Lama, Delhi School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, NewDelhias the key note speaker besides a host of other prominent dignitaries, invitees, experts, resource persons, delegates and participants from the State and other states of India as well as participants from abroad.

The inaugural function commenced with the felicitation of the dignitaries by Dr M. Dey, Vice Principal followed by a welcome song from students of the higher secondary section. Then, the welcome address was delivered by Prof B.Myrboh, President, Governing Body, Shillong College. While warmly welcoming the gathering he dwelt on the dynamics of education and its challenges thereby necessitating the importance of organizing such programme to develop awareness and stimulate in-depth discussions which will focus on meeting crucial needs and demands of a developing country.

A brief introduction of the Diamond Jubilee Celebration was presented by Dr K. D. Ramsiej, Principal, Shillong College. Dwelling on the journey of the college since its humble inception in Jail Road Boy's High School on 15th August, 1956, he acknowledge the contributions of its founders and emphasized that the college would continue to strive for excellence and serve the society with a focus on the underprivileged.

Then, the keynote address was presented by Prof. Mahendra. P. Lama, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi. The key note address which was given with a power point presentation entitled Border to Borderland: Relocating connectivity in the NERwas highly illuminating and thought-provoking. While elaborating on the geometric, nationalistic concept of borders he argued on the need to change our focus from the borders to borderlands.While referring to connectivity he asserted that the NER which shares ninety nine per cent of its border with other countries, has ample scope of *'globalising the local'* for economic

returns which could be promoted by nurturing multilateral relations. He further stated that this revisiting the concept of the borders especially in the context of North East is paramount and would be a turning point in the discourse for Mainland and North-East relations.

After the key note presentation, the Guest of Honor, Prof S.K Srivastava, Vice Chancellor North Eastern Hill University address the august house. While congratulating the College for its Diamond Jubilee he pointed out to the significance of the seminar in the context of the Act East Policy and stressed that education is a powerful tool for Inclusive growth of the Region and the country.

To mark the Diamond Jubilee Celebration, a Documentary on Shillong College entitled *60th Milestone* was released by the Hon'ble Chief Guest. The ten-minute documentary which was shown in the august house clearly illuminated the journey of the college since its inception to the present day.

This was followed by the release of an ISBN Publication entitled *"Sonder", A Collection of Essays, Poems & Short Stories from North East*; editorial board: Department of English, Shillong College, Wordsmith Publishers, Guwahati, India with **ISBN No. 978-93-84455-02-6**.

This publication is an outcome of the Two-Day National Workshop on "Creative Writing in English" which was organized by the Department of English in collaboration with North East Writers' Forum on the 21st and 22nd May, 2015. Smt. Amanda Basaiawmoit, one of the editors briefly highlighted about the publication and then presented it for release by the Chief Guest.

Then the inaugural address was delivered by the Chief Guest Shri Conrad Sangma Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Meghalaya. The dignitary reflected on our Hon'ble Prime Minister, Narendra Modi Vision of 2020- A Young India and emphasized that educational institutions play a pivotal role towards grooming India into a super power. Highlighting the importance of the Seminar he reiterated that at present there is a need for a coordinating agency to help the North

East tap into the potential of cross border connectivity which would lead to inclusive growth of the region.

After the inaugural address a short cultural programme showcasing the diverse ethnic attire of the tribes of Meghalaya was presented by the students of the college. Finally, the programme concluded with the vote of thanks delivered by Dr (Mrs.) E.Kharkongor, Convener, Diamond Jubilee Celebration, and Coordinator, IQAC followed by refreshments.

72. Closing Ceremony of the Diamond Jubilee Celebration coinciding with the Valedictory Function of the Two Day International Seminar on 25th August 2017. A brief highlight of the function is as follows:

The closing ceremony of the Diamond Jubilee Celebration of the college which was graced by Dr Mukul Sangma Hon'ble Chief Minister, Government of Meghalaya as the Chief Guest and Shri H.D.R Lyngdoh, Hon'ble Home Minister, Government of Meghalaya as the Guest of Honour was attended by 201 participants from within and outside the Country besides other prominent dignitaries, invitees, experts, resource persons and a host of others besides faculties and students from the college.

The function commenced at 3.30 PM. Prior to the start of the closing ceremony the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Government of Meghalaya inaugurated the Diamond Jubilee Building in the presence of Shri H.D.R Lyngdoh, Hon'ble Home Minister, Government of Meghalaya, Dr K.D Ramsiej, Principal, Dr M. Dey, Vice Principal, Shri K. D. Roy, Vice Principal, Professional Courses, Convener, Diamond Jubilee, invitees, guests, NCC Cadets, Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff and students of the college. Then the dignitaries proceeded towards the dais for the formal programme.

The programme began with the felicitation of the dignitaries by Shri K. D. Roy, Vice Principal, Professional Courses followed by a welcome song again from students of the higher secondary section. Then, the welcome address was delivered by Dr K.D Ramsiej, Principal, Shillong College. While warmly welcoming the gathering he highlighted on the strategic location of the North Eastern States and the role that they can play in international trade and inclusive growth through

cross border connectivity. Dr K. D. Ramsiej pointed out that the international seminar is a befitting way of concluding the Diamond Jubilee Celebrations of the college and reflected that in these 61 years, the college has seen many transformations and changes which have opened up new challenges. He reiterated that, as the college boldly steps into the new decade, its primary goal remains the same, to impart quality education and mould the students into responsible future citizens of this great country.

The Report of the Diamond Jubilee Celebration was then presented by Dr (Mrs.) E. Kharkongor, Convener, Diamond Jubilee Celebration. The report highlighted that the inaugural function to celebrate 60 years of the College began on 14th July, 2016 with a Two Day National Seminar on Applied Ethics on the theme: “Issues in Contemporary Society: Rights, Duties and Sustainability In Search Of Harmony” organized by the Department of Philosophy in collaboration with IQAC on 14th – 15th July, 2016. A number of activities and events including both academic and extra-curricular were then organized and conducted by various departments, committees, cells, alumni, library, non-teaching staff and others to culminate with the grand finale of the closing ceremony.

A momentous event of the celebration is that the College is acknowledging and expressing its gratitude to Jail Road Boys High School from where the college was started on 15th August, 1956. The College is also acknowledging the contributions of 31 retired staff (teaching and non-teaching), and are not beneficiaries under the Social Maintenance Scheme 2011. All these felicitations will be taken up during the grand function.

To add meaning to the celebration, the Convener pointed out the College proposes to reach out to the community. In this regard it would identify and adopt a community to extend literary support and other services and Mawkasiang Village has been identified for the purpose.

This was followed by the Rapporteur’s report presented by Dr (Mrs) S. Khyriemujat, Joint Convener, International Seminar. The Report clearly highlighted on the salient features of the entire proceedings discussed and deliberated during the different technical sessions. She noted that

the sessions were highly interactive and thought provoking and the findings would be summarized to serve as suggestions for policy decisions.

The Participants Remarks were then presented by Dr Md S. Khan, Professor of Economics, West Bengal and Dr Tshewang Norbu, Assistant Professor, Gaeddu, College of Business Studies, Royal University of Bhutan. The participants while congratulating the college on its Diamond Jubilee celebration express their gratitude and thankfulness for the excellent hospitality that had been shown towards them. They also expressed their satisfaction for all the arrangements made for the different technical sessions which had allowed them ample scope for presentations, discussions and deliberations. Finally, they urged upon the College to organize collaborative programmes in the future with institutes in the country and abroad. An invitation was offered by Dr Tshewang Norbu from Royal University of Bhutan for such collaborative programmes in the future. Such programmes would not only enable the interchange of ideas but would also create opportunities for students exchange programmes. All these would contribute to the dynamics of the institution and to the society.

This was followed by an address from the Hon'ble Guest of Honor Shri H.D.R. Lyngdoh, Home Minister, Government of Meghalaya. The dignitary shared his experience and affirmed that lack of education is the major problem that has hindered development. He lauded the efforts of the College more so for reaching out to the students in the rural areas and for spreading value education in the State.

Then the programme for acknowledging the contributions of our founders and felicitating the retired staff followed. Dr M. A documentary film entitled *Mi Amua* showcasing the religious ceremony performed by the indigenous Garo tribes in connection with Jhum cultivation was also released. The documentary has been directed by Smt. L. D. Marak, Department of Garo and sponsored by the Chief Minister's VAF Fund.

This was followed by the valedictory address by the Chief Guest, Dr Mukul Sangma, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Meghalaya. In his address the Chief Guest congratulated Shillong College in all its endeavours to provide quality education, and salutes everyone who has contributed in the process. He stressed that the borders of North East have not been exploited to its potential and the biggest challenge is to create and identify the opportunities that exists for cross border connectivity and inclusive growth. He also highlighted that the government is also coming up with different projects in order to promote education so as to arrive at a comprehensive plan that would lead to inclusive growth of the State, the region and the entire country.

After the valedictory address a short cultural programme representing the different dances of the tribes of Meghalaya was presented by the students of the college.

The closing ceremony then concluded with the vote of thanks delivered by Dr S.Sarma, Convener, International Seminar. After the vote of thanks the Hon'ble Chief Guest then declared the Diamond Jubilee Celebration closed.
