





A Brief Report on the Field Trip organised by the Department of Sociology, Shillong College to Dain Thlen, Sohra on the 7th December 2017.


On the 7th December 2017, the Department of Sociology organised a field trip to Dain Thlen, Sohra. The main objective of the trip was to give the students firsthand experience and understand the richness of the culture of the Khasi, tribe of Meghalaya. Further, through this trip, the students will be able to develop analytical skill on areas of indigenous beliefs and folklore of the Khasi society.

With enthusiasm the students of 4th and 6th Semester Honours gathered in the college and at around 7.20 am we all departed on a local bus. We started with joy, fun, laughter and the students were filled with zeal to learn and know more about the cultural beliefs behind this historical site. On reaching Dain Thlen, we explored the site and the teachers of the departed recounted the folklore of the myth of U Thlen. The Students gained knowledge through the entire trip and they were divided into groups and to give a presentation on their understanding about the myths and beliefs of the Khasi tribe.


We then returned back all the way to Shillong and around 7 pm we reached college premises, happy and fulfilled we all were, knowledge was imparted and learning was infused.

The Trekking started around noon on 25th April 2019, the air is filling with excitement and anticipation, the student and their team along with teachers from Commerce Department of Shillong College arrives, the starting point of the trek is from the south west of the Mawsmmai village located about 600 meter from main road. The day start with the visit to the ruin of Mawsmmai-Chatak Ropeway station, well known as Double-Drive; it is one of the heritage site which was open in 24th February 1930 by Ebert Lucas Hammond the then Governor of Assam. This location is situated on top of the hills which can give clear view of surrounding meadows and breath taking valley and clear view of the Bangladesh Plain.

The Journey Continue after the introduction and information share with students, from this point the journey continue towards the Mawblang Village; after the walking distance of about 700 meter the student witness another heritage site, the portion of railway track of the Cherra –Company Ganj, which was open in 6th June 1886, this railway was operational just for few year and come into closure due to the impact of Earthquake of 1897, thou it was the great initiative of Hubert Kench the Railway engineer of that era, it was never recover from the impact and devastation, which ultimately its wonderful service stop in 1900. As the journey unfold with questions and answers our team led




them to another natural wonder, the natural sink hole which locally is known as 'Damum' this natural wonder is accessible only during dry season or before the monsoon, in the floor of this natural wonder one can find flowing river in the middle of the sand and surround with trees on the edge, it fills with wild flowers, ferns, reeds and grass; wild shrubs and butterflies.

The journey continue from this point toward the village, Mawblang village is the main station for many decade as the main hub for merchants to carry goods to and fro the border hats, its important lost with the opening Mawsmi-Shella road, thus it seem its history was left untold and unknown to many. As we gather to wait for other students, here we stand on part of the David Scott Trails, which was part of David Scott trails which connect Nongkhlaw-Mawphlang-Sohra and Mawsmi then it continue towards the plain of Bangladesh. It was a privilege day for student to be able to witness and re trace the footsteps of our ancestor and see their skill edge in every single piece of those blocks, along this route we move down south and feel the breeze and witness the majestic valleys fill with green trees; the journey unfold with lots of selfie and photo session along the route. The group divert the journey from the junction with Mawsmi-Shella road towards Motpalong Park; here some of the group are sitting down for lunch before we start the descend along the ancient trade route, from this point one can witness 180 degree view of Bangladesh plain during clear day. The Laittyra village and Thangkharang village are clearly visible and towards south-west the village of Mawlong and Laitkynsew plateau are playing hide and seek with the clouds.

From this point the journey continue towards Thangkharang village along the ancient trails through the semi-tropic jungles, the decent continue with sweat and cram legs of some of the students, laughter, jokes and some loud music in intervals, that seem to compete with some birds that singing in the tree branch. Finally we reach the approach road toward the Park; as we move towards the park we could see the buses are waiting in the parking; it was a sunny day and everyone are tired and running for water but it does enlighten the students about the hardship and journey our ancestors had experience and build this generation, so the day of the journey is conclude in the Thangkhrang Park with



On the 21st September, 2019 under the guidance of the faculty, the B.Sc. (Environmental Science) 3rd and 5th Semester students of Department of Environmental Science, Shillong College embarked on a field trip to Mawphlang Sacred Grove, Mawphlang, East Khasi Hills Meghalaya. The one day trip was carried out in partial fulfilment of the requirements of the B.Sc. degree in Environmental Science. The purpose of the trip was to give students a field based studies on areas promoting biodiversity conservation. Sacred groves are regarded as one of the traditional ways for conserving biodiversity on a degraded landscape.

On reaching the sacred grove the team prepared for the trek through the forest under the guidance of a local guide, Mr. Wanshai Wahlang.

Before entering the forest, the students were briefed about the importance of sacred grove in biodiversity conservation. The local guide gave a short introduction and history of the sacred grove. The total area of the site is approximately 80 ha. The site is regarded as a sacred grove by local communities. The grove is believed to be the dwelling place of a local forest spirit/deity known as the *Basa* and has served as a site of for the performance of rituals and for the coronation of Chieftains/Kings of the *Hima* in the past. Due to local belief in the sacredness of the site, the extraction of any materials or items from the forest is strictly prohibited. Local communities believe that the violation of this tenet can lead to negative impact upon the life and health of the violator. The forest is believed to be 800 years old and is considered to be an example of an undisturbed climax forest. Tourism is allowed in the forest, accompanied by local guides who ensure not only the safety of visitors, but also that they do not in any way damage the forest.

The students were explained about the trees and plants inside the forest. Large deciduous trees along with few species of pteridophytes and gymnosperms are also observed. Trees like *Rhododendron arboreum*, *Quercus fenestrata*, *Viburnum dilatatum*, *Myrica esculenta*, *Myrica nagi*, and the critically endangered species *Ilex khasiana* were shown to students. The forest shows a largely closed canopy with reduced light penetration, a notable understory and comparatively sparse forest floor growth due to reduced light penetration. Despite being characterized as dominated by growth of deciduous, the grove does demonstrate growth of *Pinus kesiya*.

The students were also told that the forest is also home to approximately 70 species of birds, most of which are of the order Passeriformes. Species cited during the field visit are as follows: the Grey Sibia (*Heterophasia gracilis*), Whiskered Yuhina (*Yuhina flavicollis*),



Golden Throated Barbet (*Megalaima franklinii*), *Phylloscopus* sp. leaf warblers, Niltava (*Niltava grandis*) and Green tailed sunbird (*Aethopyganepalensis*).

Monoliths and stone tables which are indicative of the native animistic religion were observed throughout the grove. According to the guide however, rituals have not been performed in the grove in over 60 years and coronation ceremonies for chieftains/kings are no longer carried out within the grove.

The trip that was undertaken was of great benefit to the students. They had the opportunity to observe the importance of traditional practices that contribute to bio resource and bio diversity conservation. They also learnt about the importance of sacred grooves as a mean of in situ conservation as well as the ecosystem services they provide in terms of water conservation, soil conservation, carbon sink, etc. Mr. Wahlang also imparted valuable knowledge about plants of ethnomedicinal importance along with the uses of numerous other plants. Apart from the environmental related topics, the trip also highlighted the economic value of the Mawphlang Sacred Grove as a means of generating revenue and employment to the people of Mawphlang village. This trip has help in increasing the knowledge of the students about the significance, importance and value of Sacred Grooves
