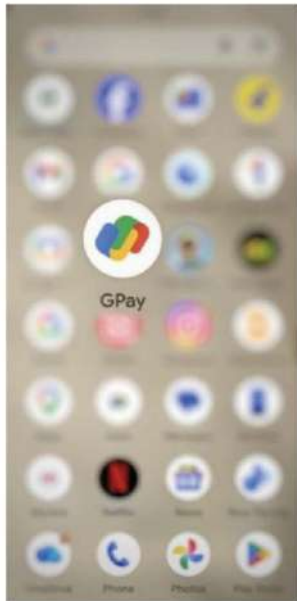

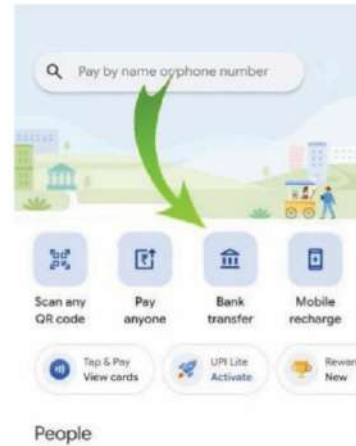

HOW TO MAKE PAYMENT

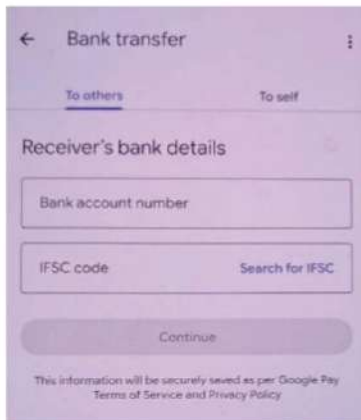
Step 1. Open your “Google Pay” App.
