- **FACULTY & STUDENTS' DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME -- A CONTINUOUS PROCESS**





ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT (6th Batch, 2018)**


The cell conducted the UGC Sponsored Certificate Course on Entrepreneurship Development (2019) for the 6th batch and twenty six participants completed the course.



Ms. Darity Nongkynrih is also into Piggery. With the training, knowledge and exposure during the Course, especially in marketing, accounts, and others; these participants are upgrading and formalising their ventures. However, the participants who have started as well as those who are willing to start their ventures are having many constraints in regard to capital, funding, infrastructure, etc. which should be looked upon in the hand-holding and follow-up process.

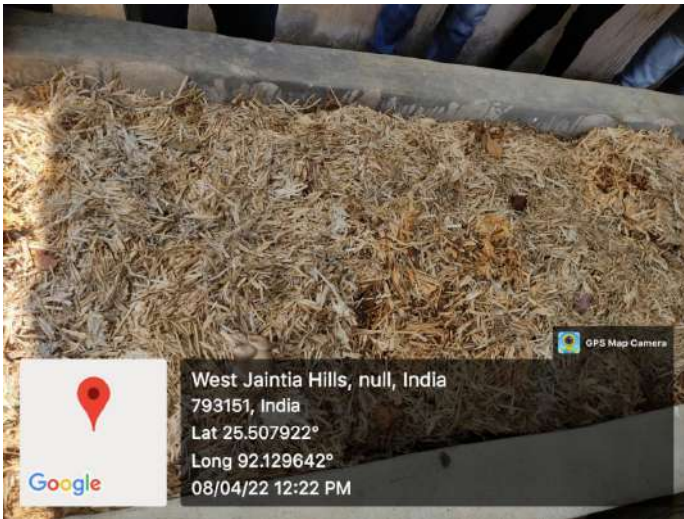

INTRODUCTION

In the present day context of market driven forces and private initiatives, it is imperative to sensitize; motivate and train the people especially the educated youths in developing private initiatives and generating self-employment opportunities. In view of these challenges, Shillong College established the Entrepreneurship Development Cell on 10 August, 2011, to play a strategic role of both trainer and facilitator of entrepreneurship development. To fulfill one of the main objectives of the Cell which is to conduct certificate or diploma courses that will enhance competencies and build capacity for a career in entrepreneurship, the Cell prepared a syllabus for the Three Months Certificate Course in Entrepreneurship. The syllabus was then forwarded to UGC, New Delhi through the College Development Council, NEHU, for due consideration. In March, 2013, the University Grants Commission approved the course under Career Oriented Courses.

The Course structure is designed to ensure that the competencies, motivation, opportunity analysis, business plan, linkage with funding agencies, management of resources, legal formalities and other related requirements necessary for an entrepreneur in setting up micro/small enterprises are incorporated in the course.

The main objective of the course is to motivate students and create the necessary competencies for a career in entrepreneurship.

The expected outcome of this course is that students would have the basic skills to initiate their enterprise; knowledge about finance, marketing strategies and human resource management. They would not only have a definite idea about the support and development agency available but would have the necessary know-how for assembling their resources.

Successively affiliated to Gauhati University and then to North-Eastern Hill University, the college's pre-eminence in the field of higher education in North-East India is well established by its student strength and long list of achievers. With a staff strength of over 130 (teaching and support staff) twenty-two options for Honours, the college caters to around 3500 students with the number likely to go up to 5000 students in 2022. With rural youth in its fold, students from different ethnic communities and international students on its rolls, it is a microcosm of the North-East and a vibrantly alive experiment of national integration at its best. From 2004 the College has decisively taken a new direction in its emphasis by enthusiastically launching out into a number of professional courses that should go a long way in developing skilled and knowledgeable manpower in the region as well as creating avenues for self-employment. In 2018 the College reached a new milestone, it became the first College in Meghalaya to offer (NEHU affiliated) Post Graduate Programme in English. The College has evolved into an active hub engaged in a number of extension activities emerging out of its academic programmes. TIMELINE OF DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES







In its effort to promote entrepreneurial mindset amongst the youth in the college, the Entrepreneurship Development Cell, Shillong College, in collaboration with PRIME Meghalaya, North Eastern Council (NEC) and Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Kolkata Innovation Park, organised its first Awareness Session on North East Entrepreneurship Development Programme on the 13th September, 2022, in Shillong College Auditorium at 11.00 am to 12.30 pm, where a total of approximately 150 participants which include students from all streams (Arts/Science/Commerce/Professional Courses) and the past participants of the EDC Certificate Course attended the session. The objective of the programme is to create awareness among the youth with respect to the different support system and schemes brought out by the government to promote start ups in the entire North East Region. The Principal gave her welcome address, where she welcomed the resource persons and stress on the importance of the programme where the mission is to encourage students to become job creators and not job seekers. The Resource persons for the interactive sessions were Miss Jacqueline Swer, Senior Incubation Manager, PRIME/ IIM Innovation Park Kolkata, and Mr Jeff Rani, Manager, Entrepreneurship Ecosystem Development, PRIME Meghalaya/IIM Kolkata Innovation Park. The Resource Person Miss Jacqueline Swer, created a very pleasant environment for the students whereby they were able to present the program structure of the North East Entrepreneurship Challenge (Hunt), its process, and rewards. She informed the participants about the Hunt which is a culmination of many initiatives to identify the top 270 Startups ideas in the region and provide them with recognition and rewards to enable them to transform their innovative ideas into an actual business plan. The hunt targets two groups namely Pre incubation for those who have an innovative idea or prototype stage and aids them in developing it into a sustainable business venture, and the Incubation for those startups in early revenue stage or proof of concept and supports them to commercialise or scale their business. The participants were informed about the grant which the government intends to give to the winners to help them start their business and the other forms of financial assistance which they can avail. Miss Jacqueline Swer interacts with the participants and also clarified and answered all the questions which were asked by the participants. Mr Jeff Rani presented about PRIME Meghalaya its functions and facilities in facilitating, hand holding, training and support for all the young entrepreneurs registered with them and encourage all the youth with the idea and passion to start their own business to take up the opportunities presented to them.

The programme ended with a vote of thanks by the Shri. B. Syiem, Vice Principal, Shillong College.

SUMMARY OF THE PROGRAMME

This course was inaugurated on the 18th of August and enrolled a number of participants. 39 participants have successfully completed the course and are going to be felicitated on the 30th November 2017.

In this course participants were given an informative insight upon the concept, assessment, sources and characterisation of solid waste. Information about proper collection, collection systems, frequency, and transportation of waste was deliberated to the students. Matters relating to the proper management of Hazardous wastes and Bio Medical waste and also their scientific disposal were also taught to the participants. Study materials and lecture on laws and rules which are important in the field of waste management were also part of the course.

Important aspects of solid waste management and how it can be viewed as resource for entrepreneurial ventures was impressed upon the participants. Effective waste

management processes such as source reduction, segregation, sorting, composting, vermi composting, and disposal methods were part of the curriculum. Reusing and Recycling techniques which prevent materials from entering the waste stream are a great source for entrepreneurial ideas and a number of such techniques were shared with the participants. Another topic that was taught under this course was energy recovery from waste which included pyrolysis, gasification, anaerobic digestion etc.

The course encourages the participants to have an entrepreneurial mindset where they use the different topics being taught to them as a repository for entrepreneurial creativity. To ensure that the participants are equip with knowledge to change their ideas into businesses entrepreneurial development inputs were also taught to them so that they have a proper understanding on how to build a business. The following topics were covered under EDP inputs:

- Developing Entrepreneurial attitude and skills
- Identifying Business Opportunity in Solid waste
- Sources of Funding projects
- Making a business plan
- Legal formalities & taxation policy
- Management of resources (money, men, materials and machines)
- Marketing management.

Awareness Programme:

Two participants from the course, namely Mebaaihun Sunabi and Alvareena P. Kahit were selected as resource persons for a Solid Waste Awareness Programme conducted by the NCC unit of Shillong College for the NCC cadets of the college.

Field Trips/ training programme:

- Field trips to the Solid Waste Landfill site at Mawiong were undertaken where training in Bokashi composting, vertical composting etc was given to the participants.
- Training for using waste as a resource was done at Bethany Society Shillong
- Another training on recycling and reusing of paper was also conducted at Bethany Society Shillong

The Two Month Course on Solid Waste Management with Entrepreneurial Development Inputs was conducted by the Department of Environmental Science and Entrepreneurial Development Cell of Shillong College between August and October in 2017. This course entails various aspects of solid waste management and also provided participants of the course with numerous training programs with regard to the subject matter. The course also taught the students about the entrepreneurial potential of using waste as a resource and educated them about the important basics of creating and running a successful business venture.

Academically, with Environmental Science being a compulsory subject and waste management being part of the curriculum, this course will most definitely be advantageous to better understand the different features of waste management, its importance and application. This course has further increased the awareness level of the participants and gives them the ability to spread their knowledge with not only their peers but with other people around them as well. The interactive training sessions that were conducted also gave the participants hands on experienced about various waste management techniques which can be used as entrepreneurial ideas in the future to generate self employment if needed.

We also keep in contact with various participants to help and guide them with any queries regarding what they have learnt from the course. We are also happy to share that a few of our participants are engaging with solid waste management practices and a couple of them have initiated small ventures on their own. An insight of their works are as follows:

Mebaaihun Sunabi:

Mebaaihun Sunabi started a home based venture called Organic Tribe. This venture

was formed based on inspiration drawn from reducing generation of toxic and hazardous waste which Meba had picked up as a participant of the course. The vision of Organic Tribe is to encourage an eco friendly lifestyle with the products it makes. Organic Tribe produces organic based soap and lip balms which are sold at reasonable rates. Based on information from Ms. Mebaaihun, the demand for her products has been steadily rising. One can make orders from instagram and facebook pages of Organic Tribe or contact Ms. Mebaaihun herself. Containers are also reused and discounts are given to the customers who bring back the containers for refills.



Obedson Lamare:

Mr. Obedson has started Vermi Composting and is now under the process of forming a self help society where various types of work will be carried out and one of them being the production of Vermi-Compost which he had learned during the two months course that he

attended in the college. Highlighted below is his trail run of making vermin compost by incorporating egg shells and tea leaves.
