

# The College Inblem

The White Background in the middle stands for our humble beginnings when a few noble, caring and dedicated souls established this college on 15<sup>th</sup> August 1956 in order to address and cater to the needs of the less privileged sections of society for whom higher education and the world of knowledge would have practically remained out of bounds. This colour also stands for simplicity, purity, transparency and clarity of thought achieved through knowledge.



#### Under-graduate Courses

Semester System – As per the guidelines of the North Eastern Hill University (NEHU) Semester System was introduced from the academic session 2015 - 2016 onwards. Under the system a student shall appear for 1800 marks in 6 semesters. Out of this 1000 marks are allotted for Pass elective Subjects and 800 marks for the Honours Elective Subjects. Each paper has two components viz, Internal Examination and External Examination where marks are divided in the ratio ¼ and 3/4.

#### NEHU Affiliated MA Programme in English

Shillong College (NAAC Accreditated 'A') is the first college in Meghalaya to offer an Masters Programme in English. The Two Year (four semesters) Programme is affiliated to NEHU. The College started with its first batch of Post Graduate students in the year 2018 with the authorised intake allowed in take of 20 students. Selection of candidates is strictly based on a two-tier Entrance Examination and the rank secured in the Entrance Merit List. The general eligibility for the Entrance examination is 45% at the Degree level.

#### CERTIFICATE COURSE IN KHASI TRADITIONAL MUSIC

The Department of Khasi, Shillong College, Shillong has been conducting the Six Months Career Oriented Certificate Course in Khasi Traditional Music since 13<sup>th</sup>February 2018. Permission was granted by the College Development Council, NEHU (No.CDC/6/Sh.C/2014/Vol.III (Part)-1733, Dated. 18<sup>th</sup>July 2018).

The objective of the course is to inculcate into the students about the basic understanding of Khasi Traditional Music and to train them to develop their vocational skills in this area.

The students who complete the Khasi Traditional Music Certificate Course are qualified for the Post Graduate Diploma in Music, NEHU, Shillong. Also this course trains the students in the vocational skill of crafting Khasi musical instruments.

#### CERTIFICATE COURSE IN ANDROID APP DEVELOPMENT

The short term add-on course on Android App Development is annually conducted by the Department of Computer Science and Applications for a duration of 3 months. It was started in 2017 under the tutelage of Shri D Thabah, Shri R. Hoojon and Shri T. Warjri.

Android is a software stack for mobile devices that includes an operating system, middleware and key applications. The Android SDK provides the tools and APIs necessary to begin developing applications on the Android platform using the Java programming language.

The Add on Course introduces students to mobile application development for the Android platform whereby students learn the skills for creating and deploying Android applications.

#### CERTIFICATE COURSE IN ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT

The Entrepreneurship Development Cell recognized that a more concerted effort was needed to incorporate entrepreneurial dynamism especially amongst the educated youths, and this can be facilitated through entrepreneurial courses and training. Keeping in mind that one of the main objectives of the Cell is to organize Certificate or Diploma Courses that will serve as an added advantage for the unemployed youths for self-employment, the task for fulfilling this objective was taken up.

Faculty members of the Cell namely Dr. (Mrs.) E. Kharkongor, Smt. P. Khonglah & Shri. S. Lyngskor then prepared and framed the Syllabus for the Three Months Certificate Course in Entrepreneurship Development. This was submitted to the UGC for approval. The UGCs approval was received and it had also sanctioned Rs 7.00 lakhs (rupees seven lakhs only) as Seed Money for starting the Certificate Course (UGCs Letter dated 31<sup>St</sup>March, 2013).

Hence, the task for conducting the UGC Sponsored Three Months Certificate Course in Entrepreneurship Development Course was started by the Cell .

The expert resource persons and trainers are drawn not only from the college but from different organizations, government departments, industries and financial institutions such as KVIC, KVIB, SBI, MIDC, DHHDC, DIC, Bethany Society, Polaris Solutions Enterprise, LIFCOM, Taxation Department, Tourism etc. Prominent and successful entrepreneurs of the state were also invited for interactions and deliberations which aimed at enhancing the practical significance of the course. The cell has so far successfully conducted training for 6 batches of students.



### Placement

For the final year students placements and opportunities are provided through agencies or industries. Such placements via enternships, helps in inculcating employability skills to equip students to face the real world. It also makes the students acquainted with the knowledge of a particular industry or sector. This in turn makes them confident in taking the right decisions apart from sowing the seed of success in the career they opt for.

For holistic development of our students and making jobs available to them the Placement cell conducts many grooming sessions, seminar sessions and organizes both off and on Campus Placement opportunities. The placement cell thus tries to bridge the gap between Academia and Industry.


### STUDENT CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTENSION PROGRAMMES

#### NCC

NCC was introduced in Shillong College in 1963, with the then Head of the Department of Commerce, Capt. D S Rawat as the Associate NCC Officer (ANO). Being an avid sportsman himself he motivated and encouraged the young students to take up NCC which led many to become commissioned officers in the Army. At present the young military brigade of Shillong College comprises of both boys and girls enrolled as Senior Division and Senior Wing cadets of the oldest and largest voluntary organisation of India, comprising a total of 103 (50- Girls & 53 Boys).

The Shillong College Boys' wing of the NCC, at present, is being looked after by Capt. (Dr.) B. P. Tripathi. The NCC Shillong College Girls is under the charge of CTO (Dr.) Batriti Nongbri, of the Environmental Science Department.

Over the years, the NCC cadets of the College have been participating in various training camps, competitions, Republic Day Camps, National Integration Camps etc. which included All India Advance Leadership Course, Army Attachment, Mountaineering, All India Summer TrainingCourse, Para-jumping etc. and brought laurels to the College as well as the State. The NCC cadets have also been regularly taking part and have received various decorations at Camps such as Combined Annual Training Camp, National Integration Camps, Mountaineering and Trekking Expeditions, ThalSainik Camps, Pre Republic day Camps, Military Hospital Attachment Camps, Army Attachment Camps to name a few apart from taking part in various other activities such as Swaacch Bharat campaign, Blood Donation Drives, Tree Plantation Programmes and a host of others.



#### 2. NSS

Shillong College is amongst the four Colleges in the region to have formally started National Service Scheme (NSS) as early as in 1974. It started with an Orientation Programme held in the same year in St.Edmund's College that was followed by holding of the first special camp in Laitumkhrah on February 1974 by the NSS, Unit Shillong College. At present Shri M.W. Synrem, Dr. (Mrs) S. Khyriemmujat, Smt. A.Marbaniang, Shri S.Kharrymba, Shri E.Niang and Smt. S.P.M. Kharbih are program officers and have been providing commendable services. The NSS Unit of the college has six adopted villages at present and they are Smit Village, laitkseh Village, Nongpathaw Village, Nongmadan Village, Nongtyngur Village and Umroh (Mawkasiang) Village. Apart from the Special Camping programmes, are the regular activities are conducted in these adopted villages which include right from Health Care and sanitation programs to Environmental protection and Water Conservation programmes.



#### 3. RED RIBBON CLUB

The Red Ribbon Club has been established in Shillong College in the year 2006 under National AIDS Control Programme (NACP). All students are expected to be involved in the Club for 16 hours annually, Vide MOU signed on 6<sup>th</sup> August 2013 between Department of Higher Education (MHRD), GOI & Department of AIDS Control, MHFW, GOI.
