On the basis of the result of written test and also having been declared by the competent medical authority, the undersigned, as empowered under Delhi Police (Appointment & Recruitment) Rules, 1980, hereby given offer of appointment to M/s. GRACE FELLIDA NONGRUM Roll No. 0103 D/o SH. ARDOR DKHAR is hereby appointed as purely temporary Constable (Exe.) in Delhi Police in the pay scale of PB-1 Rs. 5200-20200 + Grade Pay Rs. 2000 and other allowances as admissible to the Central Govt. employees in an existing vacancy. She shall be posted/allocated directly to PTC, Jharoda Kalan, New Delhi for basic training.

Her appointment is made under the Delhi Police Act, 1978 and will be governed under the Rules made there under. She will also be governed by the Central Civil Service (Temporary Services) Rules-1965 and CCS (Conduct) Rules-1964.

Her appointment is also subject to the following terms and conditions:-

1. The offer of appointment is to be valid on execution of an agreement bond with regard to refund of salary, cost of uniform, capitation charges etc. in case she leaves the department without completing 5 years of service if confirmed, from the date of her appointment.
2. Her appointment is subject to the caste/tribe certificate being verified through proper channels and if the verification reveals that the claim of belonging to SC/ST/OBC, as the case may be, is false, the services will be terminated forthwith without assigning any further reason thereof and without prejudice to such further action as may be taken under the provision of law for production of false certificate.
3. Her appointment will be liable for termination if the facts given by her in the Declaration Form/Undertaking are found to be incorrect in any material aspect and she will be further liable to refund the money spent on his training or given to her from the State Exchequer. She shall also be debarred from Govt. Services in future, besides intimation of legal action against her.
4. She will be on probation for a period of two years from the date of her appointment.
5. Her appointment is purely temporary and liable for termination without assigning any reasons thereof.
6. Her basic training is for nine months or as may be decided by the Commissioner of Police, Delhi.
7. No trainee shall be accepted/allowed for training at PTS after 10 days of commencement of training exceptional circumstances and that too with the prior approval of the Commissioner of Police, Delhi.
8. She shall not be passed into the rank/sent to the District/Unit to which she is allocated for drawl of pay unless she has successfully completed the training and has "passed-out" of the PTS.
9. She is required to qualify in the final examination conducted at the end of the training course. A chance may be given to her, if she fails her services will be terminated under Rule-5 of the CCS (Temporary Services) Rules-1965.

Projects given to politically connected contractors

SRI LINGA The KSU of South West Khasi Hills has political chief secretary K. S. Banerjee as its chairman of Special Purpose Vehicle Committee (SPVC) and approved bills about the inclusion of funds to the implementation of the SPVC-funded development projects within the KSU's Project Area.

KSU writes to Kropha, seeks intervention
